



## Small Pot Recommendations

Varieties listed under Small Pots are those whose plant habits lend themselves to production in 4" (10 cm) to 4 ½" (11-12 cm) pots. Producing callas in small pots demands even more attentive management of cultural practices than does producing in larger pots. Watering regimes (in an effort to grow them neither too wet or too dry); fertilizer regimes (in an effort to not over-feed nitrogen for too much leaf growth); temperature regimes (in an effort to keep the plants compact and to harden the plants- especially as flowers push in stage three); Bonzi regimes (tailored by variety to both the cultivar's sensitivity to Bonzi and its natural stature); and, adequate spacing during finishing (to prevent tall and columnar plants) are all critical factors worthy of special consideration when producing small pots.

For the above reasons, producers new to potted calla production may wish to get familiar with the crop by growing 6" (15 cm) to 6 ½" (16-17 cm) or even larger pots before attempting large-scale small pot production.
